MOSES LAKE WATER

EXPANSION 04-105 Cou. Barrus moved to approve the line extension to Moses Lake to be tied in at 10<sup>th</sup> Street West and 5<sup>th</sup> Street West subject to the following:

- 1- That the 6<sup>th</sup> Street, 4" line crossing to Moses Lake and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 1" crossing to Moses Lake be abandoned.
- 2- Town be given permission and access to read the meters.
- 3- That the Blood Tribe will be responsible for all costs associated with the project.
- 4- That as development proceeds, the number of residential and commercial sites are as per the agreement of December 16, 2003, which is 150 residential sites and 15 commercial, institutional, or trade sites.
- 5- That the project receives the necessary approvals from Alberta Environment.
- 6- That the Moses Lake filling station be discontinued in 2005 after the Town constructs a new filling station, and that the Town can cap the line and discontinue the service to the Moses Lake filling station.
- 7- That isolation valve and back-flow preventors be installed on the supply side of each line connecting to the Town services.
- 8- That in item seven above and within the Town of Cardston and prior to the water meters that the Town reserves the right to tie on to the service side of the line.
- 9- That the water meters are a minimum 4" size and installed with isolation valves and the meters are compatible to the Town of Cardston meters.
